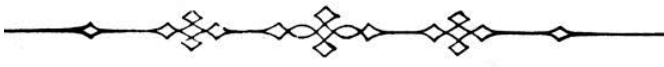

Fred "Shacky" Aakan Sheldon Ryan, Sr.
July 14, 1936 – Feb. 22, 2023

Fred "Shacky" Aakan Sheldon Ryan, Sr., was born to Frank and Susanna Ryan in Unalakleet, Alaska, on July 14, 1936. He walked onto his next adventure on February 22, 2023, at Quyanna Care Center in Nome, AK, where he spent the last years of his life.

Shacky graduated from Mt. Edgumbe High School in Sitka, AK. After high school, he joined the Alaska Territorial Guard as a Quarter Master, where he coordinated delivery of supplies from the warehouse. When he returned to Unalakleet, he married the love of his life, Laurina Ivanoff. They spent a lot of time recreating and subsisting at their cabin on the Unalakleet River and in the surrounding countryside. He enjoyed hunting, fishing and gathering with his family to live a subsistence lifestyle.

He spent his career after ATG with the United States Postal Service, where he served as Postmaster for 32 years. As Postmaster, he traveled to many villages to train USPS employees and attended conferences. He retired from USPS and decided to start sport fish guiding, where he met clients who returned to fish year after year.

Shacky loved to travel and spend time with his friends. He adventured to Mexico and Switzerland, Germany, Austria and France, visiting and meeting people and telling big stories.

The later years of his life were spent in Kenai, where he enjoyed spending time at the Kenaitze Elders Program for lunches, making friends, and enjoying meals and events.

Fred is preceded in death by his parents Frank and Suzanne; step mother Eu-

nice; brothers Stanley, Wilfred Sr., Timothy I, Hank, Timothy II, and his sister Mabel; son Freddie, and grandchildren Roberta, Jason I and Axel.

Aakan is survived by his children: his son Bryant Ryan, his daughter Colleen (John Odden), his daughter Jessie (Robert Huett III, his grandchildren Eric, Amber, Annabelle, Kyle, Rebecca, Jason, and great-grand children Ryder, Taylor, Erin, Calliope, Phoenix, Cypress, Jesse, Karter, Arya, Ava, and Sarah.

unfortunately, One Arctic-One Health is very much threatened by Russian politics," he said Wednesday. "It's like: Half Arctic and Very Much Health."

There is some positive movement, however.

Scientific research structure is starting to accommodate a more holistic approach, Reynolds said. The National Science Foundation, for example, now asks grant applications for statements putting proposed projects into wider context, he said. An important development is community-based research, including projects within Alaska, that address the local needs rather than the needs of outside scientists, he said.

One Alaska example is Ikaavik Sikukun, a name that translates to "Ice Bridges," that is based in the Kotzebue region. The program, which in-

cludes UAF scientists, was designed with tribal oversight and elders as managers to guide research into specific projects that are responsive to local needs. The project has produced various studies about changes to ice and water systems and the impacts to local hunters.

In the international science community, there is a growing number of "multidimensional" subjects, said Birgit Kuna, a biologist and environmental epidemiologist with the German Aerospace Center. Study of climate change in particular is increasingly focusing on health, she said Thursday. Top climate change studies published in 2022 included one, led by Georgetown University scientists, that examined how climate change increases cross-species viral spread; another led by University of Hawai'i scientist about how over half of the known human pathogenic diseases can be aggravated by climate change; and a review by the Lancet, one of the world's leading health

journals, that describes global health as being "at the mercy of fossil fuels."

More work along those lines is needed, she said. "Currently the focus is still very much on the human being surrounded by the environment as if we humans are kind of standing somewhere else and the environment is around us," she said.

Multiple environmental and health forces have affected UAF's One Health conference itself.

This year's event was plagued with travel interruptions. More than 300 people from 20 nations stretching from the Arctic to Africa registered to attend in person, with another 100 or so signing up for online attendance. But bad weather in Anchorage grounded flights; among those stuck in Anchorage was Dr. Anne Zink, Alaska's chief medical officer, a scheduled keynote speaker.

That was not as disruptive as what happened in 2020, however. An ambitious conference program was

slated for March of that year – and was abruptly scrapped when COVID-19 emerged as a global disease.

"We didn't want to be the One Health program that brought COVID to Alaska," Reynolds said.

Instead, that conference was reconstituted as an online-only event in 2021. This year's event offered on-

line participation for those who want it.
